The sixth annual outing for this boundary-pushing
arts prize is once again at London's ICA. This year's
shortlisted artists are Daria Martin, Christina
Meckie, Ryan Gander, Lali Chetwynd, Donald
Urquhart and Luke Fowler. The works they have
submitted range from a performance piece, 'An
Evening With Jabba the HutK' to a series of darkly

humorous ink drawings and thought-provoking films
(Daria Martin, 'Birds', pictured above). The winner
of the £20,000 overall prize will be announced at
the awards night on 26 April, before the exhibition
moves onto the CCA Glasgow in May.
